



Home Health Visit Information

A home health visit is a face-to-face contact between a registered nurse, licensed practical nurse or home health aide and a member at the member's place of residence.

A home health visit is not limited to a specific length of time, but is defined as an entry into the member's place of residence for the length of time needed to provide the medically necessary nursing or home health aide service(s).

Medicaid reimbursement for a home health visit does not include travel time to or from the member's place of residence. Such expenses are administrative and not reimbursable by Humana Family Medicaid.

Note: Home health providers need to use the following Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes for home health service claims: S9122, S9123, S9124, T1020, T1021, T1030 and T1031, along with the appropriate place of treatment (POT) code for reimbursement.

Place of residence is the location where a member lives and can include:

- Member's private home
- Assisted living facility (ALF)
- Developmental disabilities group home
- Foster or medical foster care home
- Any home where unrelated individuals reside together in a group

POT Code	Place Of Treatment	Description (per Agency for Health Care Administration contract and Florida statute)
12	Home	Recipient's place of residence
13	Assisted Living Facility	Any building or buildings, section or distinct part of a building, private home, boarding home, home for the aged or other residential facility, whether operated for profit or not, which undertakes through its ownership or management to provide housing, meals and one or more personal services for a period exceeding 24 hours to one or more adults who are not relatives of the owner or administrator.
14	Group Home	A residential facility licensed under Chapter 393, F.S., which provides a family living environment including supervision and care necessary to meet the physical, emotional, and social needs of its residents. The capacity of such a facility shall be at least four, but not more than 15 residents.
