

Changes to your 2023 Humana Medicare Advantage plan coverage

Dear Member,

This is important information on changes in your plan's coverage.

This notice is to let you know there are additional benefit enhancements as a result of the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 that was signed into federal law on August 16, 2022 that were not included in your original plan coverage. This information was not in your Evidence of Coverage (EOC) or your Annual Notice of Change (ANOC), if you received one, because these changes will take effect later this year.

Enhancements to your coverage are as follows:

- **Effective April 1, 2023**

- The following statement is now included in “*SECTION Changes to Benefits and Costs for Next Year,*” subsection “*Changes to Benefits and Costs for Medical Services*” of your ANOC and is now included in “*Chapter 4, Section 2.1 – Medicare Part B prescription drugs*” of your EOC:

“Some rebatable Part B drugs may be subject to a lower coinsurance.”

- **Effective July 1, 2023**

- The following statement is now included in “*SECTION Changes to Benefits and Costs for Next Year,*” subsection “*Changes to Benefits and Costs for Medical Services*” of your ANOC and in “*Chapter 4, Section 2.1*” of your EOC:

“Cost sharing for covered Part B Insulin furnished through a covered item of durable medical equipment will be no more than \$35 for a one-month (up to 30-day) supply and if your plan has a deductible, it does not apply to Part B Insulin.”

What does this mean for me?

Based on the enhanced benefits being offered to you, beginning April 1, 2023, some Part B drugs will have a lower coinsurance than your standard Part B drug coinsurance to help avoid increased cost for your Part B drugs. Any coinsurance adjustments will be made by the pharmacy at the time of purchase. Note, this does not impact your Part D prescription drug coverage. If you take Part B drugs and have questions, please feel free to contact Customer Care on or after April 1, 2023.

It also means effective July 1, 2023, you will pay no more than \$35 for a one-month (up to 30-day) supply for all Part B insulin covered by our plan, and if your plan has a deductible, it does not apply to the Part B insulin. Part B insulin is most commonly used through an insulin pump.

You are not required to take any action in response to this document, but we recommend you keep this information for future reference. If you have any questions, please call us at the number on the back of your ID card for additional information. (TTY users should call 711). Hours are from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. seven days a week from Oct. 1 – Mar. 31 and 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday-Friday from Apr. 1 - Sept. 30.
